AT&T acquires T-Mobile USA

Today's announcement of the acquisition of T-Mobile USA by AT&T is a victory for broadband proponents in both the U.S. and Germany. For the U.S., it means that T-Mobile customers will get quick access to the AT&T network, soon to include LTE or data speeds of at least 10 megabits down stream. More important, as part of the deal, AT&T is committing to build out to nearly every part of the U.S. within six years. Both AT&T and T-Mobile use GSM technology so there will be the immediate benefit of shared spectrum. Other reported deals involving T-Mobile would have joined incompatible networks; not only would that have forced a rebuild but would have required new phones for T- Mobile customers.

CWA and ver.di, the largest trade union in Germany with 2.2 million members, have partnered to support T-Mobile workers in the U.S., and the global union movement has been a strong supporter of this effort. CWA and ver.di formed a joint union – TU – that represents T-Mobile workers on both sides of the Atlantic. Hundreds of TU members in the U.S. will welcome this news since all of the possible partners, AT&T will mean better employment security and a management record of full neutrality toward union membership and a bargaining voice. For T-Mobile USA workers who want a voice in their workplace, this acquisition can provide a fresh start with T-Mobile management. Some 42,000 AT&T mobility employees are Union represented.

As with any merger or acquisition involving large entities, oversight issues will be raised. We ask all those involved to balance the inquiry with adequate weight for broadband speed and build out, employment and workers rights.

CWA Legislative Conference

The CWA Legislative Conference began on Sunday, March 20 in Sacramento. District 9 Legislative Chair is Liza Soreson. The CWA sponsored bills were presented by Angie Wei and training was conducted by Alex Rooker and Rodney Orr. On Monday and Tuesday, CWA joined California Labor Federation in meeting with elected officials and asking for their support of our bills presented. Our elected Officials State Senator Yee and Leno, along with State Assemblywoman Fiona Ma, Speaker Pro Tempore totally support our bills. State Assemblyman Tom Ammiano's senior legislative aide, Wendy Hill said "Tom supports these bills as well. The bills are:

AB400 (MA) paid sick days for all California workers-same as San Francisco paid sick leave. SB364 (YEE) corporate tax break accountability.

AB22 (MENDOZA) privacy protection.

AB51 (YAMADA) electronic payroll paycards regulations.

AB469 (SWANSON) prevent wage theft and increase the workers ability to recover stolen wages. SB459 (CORBETT) crack down on the misclassification of independent contractors.

SB698 (LIEU) create high performance standard for WIB (Workforce Investment Boards).

SB776 (DE SAULNIER) requires local WIB to invest 50% training and services, and 75% on direct service.

AB1115 (LAURA) WIB to set minimum standards for providers to be eligible for training dollars.

Just remember the San Francisco Paid Sick Leave was placed on the ballot in November 7, 2006 by Supervisors Ammiano, Daly, Mirkarimi and Maxwell with 61% of voters voting in favor of the measure and finally became an Ordinance on January 11, 2007. Working with legislators does work for us.

April Fools' Day sometimes called All Fools' Day, is one of the most light-hearted days of the year. Its origins are uncertain. Some see it as a celebration related to the turn of the seasons, while others believe it stems from the adoption of a new calendar. Ancient cultures including those of the Romans and Hindus, celebrated New Year's Day on or around April 1. It closely follows the vernal equinox (March 20th or March 21st). In medieval times, much of Europe celebrated March 25, the Feast of Annunciation, as the beginning of the new year.

Earth Day

Responding to widespread environmental degradation, **Gaylord Nelson**, a United States Senator from Wisconsin, called for an environmental teach-in, or Earth Day, to be held on April 22, 1970. Over 20 million people participated that year, and Earth Day is now observed on April 22 each year by more than 500 million people and several national governments in 175 countries. Senator Nelson, an environmental activist, took a leading role in organizing the celebration, hoping to demonstrate popular political support for an environmental agenda. He modeled it on the highly effective Vietnam War teach-ins of the time. Earth Day was first proposed in a prospectus to JFK written by Fred Dutton, however, Senator Nelson decided against much of Dutton's top-down approach, favoring a decentralized, grassroots effort in which each community shaped their action around local concerns. Senator Nelson had conceived the idea for Earth Day following a trip he took to Santa Barbara right after the horrific oil spill off the coast in 1969. Outraged by the devastation and Washington political inertia, he proposed a national teach-in on the environment to be observed by every university campus in the United States.
